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## PERSONAL PROFILE SUMMARY

Abel Idowu Olayinka earned a B.Sc (Geology) from the University of Ibadan Nigeria (1981), and M.Sc (Geophysics) from Imperial College of Science, Technology and Medicine, London (1984). He received the Overseas Research Students' Award from the Committee of Vice-Chancellors and Principals of United Kingdom Universities for his Ph.D (Geophysics) at the University of Birmingham, United Kingdom (1988). He had postdoctoral experience at Technical University Braunschweig, Germany, as a German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) Visiting Scholar (1996) and at Technical University Berlin, Germany, as Alexander von Humboldt Research Fellow (1997-1999).

He has been a member of the Faculty at the University of Ibadan for the past 36 years, the last 25 years as a full Professor. He has successfully supervised 18 Ph.D theses. He has substantial publications in many peer-reviewed outlets, with 2436 citations and h-index of 26 on Google Scholar.

He has received significant accolades in his professional career. These include *the Grover E. Murray Memorial Distinguished Educator Award* from the American Association of Petroleum Geologists (AAPG). He is recipient of the *Nigerian Mining and Geosciences Society (NMGS)/Rt. Hon Dr Nnamdi Azikiwe Gold Medal and Plaque* 'for consistently promoting and supporting the study of Earth Science subjects'. He received the NMGS/ ELF Petroleum Nigeria Limited (EPNL) First Prize Position (1998) and the NMGS/TOTAL Exploration and Production First Prize Position (2011).

He has served the University diligently, innovatively and dutifully in various capacities, including being Vice-Chancellor, Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Dean (Postgraduate School), and Head Department of Geology. He served as Chairman, Senate Curriculum Committee.

He has served as Visiting Professor, External Examiner and External Assessor for professorial candidates in many universities from 2000 till date.

He convened the First International Conference in Research and Innovation Management in West Africa in November 2006 and was elected the Foundation President of the West African Research and Innovation Management Association (WARIMA), 2006-2015. He was Chairman of the Board of Directors of the African Research Universities Alliance (ARUA) and a member

of the Council of Association of Commonwealth Universities, London. He is thus very conversant with the characteristics, prospects and challenges of higher education in Africa.

In order to respond to national manpower need and strengthen the relevance of the University, under his watch the institution undertook a massive and unprecedented expansion of the academic programmes offered by the institution. Twenty two new academic departments and four new Faculties were established. The new Faculties include Renewable Natural Resources; Economics and Management Sciences; Environmental Design and Management; and Multi- Disciplinary Studies. The Faculty of Multi-Disciplinary Studies at Ibadan is easily the first of its type in West and Central Africa, and its establishment received a filip from the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) when the University was selected for the establishment of a TETFund Centre of Excellence in Multi-Disciplinary Studies in October 2020 with an allocation of one billion naira (About Three Million US Dollars). The School of Business, incorporating a Centre for Intellectual Property and Commercialization, was upgraded to a Faculty status headed by a Dean. An innovative electronic voting platform was designed and developed in 2019.

We undertook a transformation of the Postgraduate School into a Postgraduate College headed by a Provost and two Deputy Provosts; this was an idea that was first conceived in the early 1990s.

We established a new office of Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research, Innovation and Strategic Partnerships) in 2017. The office has been involved in facilitating and maintaining local and international linkage and exchange programmes; evolving innovative need-driven university- wide academic and research projects; aggressive fund generation by attracting aids, grants, endowments, etc.,

An innovative electronic voting platform was designed and developed in-house. It was first deployed in July 2019. In spite of the initial scepticism by a large swathe of the University community, the process has subsequently been acclaimed to be transparent, seamless and very convenient with the election results displayed in real time at the end of voting. It provides an improvement in the voters turn out. This is now being used for all major elections in the University.

We undertook Public-Private-Partnership (PPP) as a structured collaborative framework that enables effective mobilization and efficient utilization of PPP resources and services for sustainable development. Students' hostels, a shopping mall and a multipurpose centre are already in place or still under construction under the PPP scheme.

Under Professor Idowu Olayinka's leadership, the research, teaching and learning, civic mission, and global influence of the University of Ibadan were transformed. The ranking of the University improved considerably to becoming number 1 in Nigeria and West Africa, number 7 in Africa and within the 401-500 band in the 2021 Times Higher Education World University Rankings.

He immediately returned to the classroom after the completion of his tenure as Vice-Chancellor and he has continued with his teaching and research activities. He spent three months in Germany (March to May 2023) as Alexander von Humboldt Research Fellow at Technical University Braunschweig. He is currently a Visiting Professor in the Department of Physical Sciences, Redeemer's University Ede, where he is the leading the establishment of a Bachelor of Science degree programme in Geosciences.

## **XIV. MANAGERIAL EXPERIENCE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF IBADAN**

### **Vice-Chancellor, December 2015 till November 2020**

Established in 1948 as University College, Ibadan, a constituent of college of the University of London UK; became autonomous in 1962. Student population about 41,438. Academic Staff 1,554; Non-Academic Staff: 3,838 as of 30 November 2020. There were 17 Faculties, 5 Institutes, 125 academic departments. Runs Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes. There is a Centre for Entrepreneurship and Innovation and a School of Business. There is a Distance Learning Centre for Open Distance Education. UI serves as host to the Pan African University for Life and Earth Sciences Institute (Including Health and Agriculture), an initiative of the African Union.

We ensured the maintenance of an active academic environment by giving more professors the opportunity to present their Professorial Inaugural Lecture (PIL). No less than 119 PILs were delivered during the period, thus clearing much of the backlog.

The Appointments and Promotions Committee for Academic Staff embarked on a comprehensive review of the Regulations and Guidelines of Promotions and this became effective in 2017. We devolved and decentralized powers to Faculties to conclude all Part I Promotion cases up to the Senior Lectureship Grade at that level. Approved cases are then forwarded to the University Appointments and Promotions Committee for Noting, with effect from the 2017 Promotion exercise. This singular measure has greatly complemented other pro-active measures we took to reduce the volume of paper work considered by the Committee with a salutary effect in a significant reduction in the processing of promotion matters. A total of 912 members of the academic staff were promoted, including 205 to the grade of Reader (Associate Professor) and 203 to the grade of full Professor. This was unprecedented in the annals of the University.

With some of our new initiatives the number of Deputy Registrar in the University was increased from 10 to 17. The Registry had never had it so good.

In order to respond to national manpower need and strengthen the relevance of the University, we undertook a massive and unprecedented expansion of the academic programmes of the University. Twenty two new academic departments and four new Faculties were established. Some of the new academic departments include Nuclear Medicine (the first of its type in Sub-Saharan Africa), Immunology, Biomedical Engineering, Automotive Engineering, Architecture, Estate Management, Quantity Surveying, Accounting, Banking and Finance, Marketing and Consumer Studies, Business Entrepreneurship and Executive Education, Pharmacology and Toxicology, Medical Humanities and Bioethics. The new Faculties include Renewable Natural Resources; Economics and Management Sciences; Environmental Design and Management; and Multi-Disciplinary Studies. The Faculty of Multi-Disciplinary Studies at Ibadan is easily the first of its type in West and Central Africa, and its establishment received a filip from the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) when the University of Ibadan was selected for the establishment of a TETFund Centre of Excellence in Multi-Disciplinary Studies in October 2020 with an allocation of **One Billion Naira** (about 3 million US Dollars).

The UI School of Business was upgraded to a Faculty status headed by a Dean. We undertook a transformation of the Postgraduate School into a Postgraduate College headed by a Provost and two Deputy Provosts; this was an idea that was first conceived in the early 1990s.

As part of a deliberate policy of administrative re-engineering, we established a new office of Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research, Innovation and Strategic Partnerships) in 2017. The office has been involved in facilitating and maintaining local and international linkage and exchange programmes; evolving innovative need-driven university-wide academic and research projects; aggressive fund generation by attracting aids, grants, endowments, etc, and through the provision of the relevant services and products to the general public; networking with relevant governmental, non-governmental and private sector organisations; cooperating with the Alumni Association to enhance the overall development of the university.

An innovative electronic voting platform was designed and developed in 2019. This has since then be deployed for elections in Senate, Congregation and Students' Union. The process was acclaimed to be transparent, seamless and very convenient with the election results displayed in real time immediately at the end of voting.

We realised that Public-Private-Partnership (PPP) is a potent tool for assisting the University towards an enduring successful pursuit of its mandate. Hence, the administration encouraged the PPP initiative, which in this context refers to a structured collaborative framework that enables effective mobilization and efficient utilization of public and private sectors' resources and services for sustainable development. It may be pointed out that the administration came into office at a period when the national economy went into economic recession. This made it more imperative to innovatively exploit the PPP option for the good of the University. A number of students' hostels, a shopping mall and a multipurpose centre are already in place or still under construction under the PPP scheme.

We embarked on a number of infrastructural projects for classrooms, office space and laboratory through funding from TETFund, Needs Assessment of the Federal Government, internally generated funds and donations from philanthropists and friends of the university. In order to improve the financial fortunes of the University, two new companies namely Platinum UI Commercial Enterprises Ltd and UISHOPWELL, were incorporated with the Corporate Affairs Commission in September 2019.

In partial fulfillment of the Vision of the University for the 21<sup>st</sup> century, to be a world- class institution for academic excellence, the ranking of the University improved considerably to becoming number 1 in Nigeria and West Africa, number 7 in Africa and within the 401-500 band in the 2021 Times Higher Education World University Rankings.

#### **Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) 2010-2014**

I completed two terms as the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic). I received inspiring letters of commendation from the Vice-Chancellor and the Registrar.

Before assuming this office, I had had the privilege of serving as a member of the Transition Implementation Committee set up by the Vice-Chancellor designate. In all, the VC appointed six sub-committees comprising Academic Affairs, on which I served as Chairman/Convener; Quality Assurance; Staff and Students Welfare and Capacity Building; Infrastructure; Governance, and General Administration. The Transition Committee produced a draft Strategic Plan for the University between September and November 2010, which was later approved both by the Senate and the Governing Council in December 2010 and February 2011, respectively. This was the document that provided a road map for the administration of the University.

I saw my preferment as the sixth Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) of the University of Ibadan as a golden opportunity to build on the solid foundation laid by my predecessors and prove my mettle. As I step down from this position, I like to thank all my colleagues, students, friends and family members for their support, encouragement and cooperation throughout the period of my stewardship. Without this invaluable assistance, my efforts probably would have being less successful. Someone not too familiar with the workings of the University might ask the question: successful at what?

The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) is expected to assist the Vice-Chancellor in the performance of his functions. He/she also serves on some Committees of Council and Senate, including Chair, Academic Planning Sub-Committee; Finance Sub-Committee and the Research Grants Sub-Committee of the Development Committee. Furthermore, he/she serves as the Chair, Committee of Provosts and Deans (COPD); Chair, Academic Links Board; Chair, Appointments and Promotions Committee of (i) Kenneth Dike Library; (ii) Institute of African Studies; and (iii) Africa Regional Centre for Information Science (ARCIS). The incumbent also chairs the Finance Committee of the Postgraduate School; the Board of the Distance Learning Centre; as well as the Board of the International Schools.

In the course of my tenure, I assisted the Vice-Chancellor in implementing his Strategic Plan, as approved by both the Senate and the Governing Council. My primary responsibility was to establish enduring structures to facilitate good governance, encourage scholarship and research as well as improve staff welfare. In this assignment, I tried to demonstrate resourcefulness, fairness, creativity and innovation, a passion for excellence and an unwavering commitment to change. I brought to bear my experience and intra-preneurial skill sets, and thus tackled some fundamental policy issues at the core of the University of Ibadan's *raison d'être*. We made deliberate efforts to emphasize the much-cherished tradition of Committee System in the University.

### **Head of Department of Geology, 2001-2002, 2006-2010**

We were involved in fund generation from alumni/alumnae, corporate institutions and friends of the Department of Geology. The money realised during such campaigns has been used to upgrade our teaching and learning facilities and the environment which is now more user-friendly. We believe that benefactions can play a vital role in supporting the training of successive generations of students. Many of our alumni and alumnae were requested to join the history of philanthropic support and help us continue to transform the lives of our students. Through this focused charitable programme of fund raising, many have joined our community of graduates who are proud to know they are supporting one of the finest teaching, research and life opportunities in the geosciences in Nigeria.

The major achievements are summarized below:

- Endowment of Prizes: The Department of Geology now has some 16 Prizes and awards generously endowed by alumni/alumnae and friends of the department at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels.
- We created the *Department of Geology Occasional Publications Series* in March 2007, with three academic titles published.
- The *Mosobalaje Oyawoye Library*, named after the foremost African Geologist and first African Head of our Department, received a major facelift, in terms of computer hardware and software, recent journal collections and current books.
- We established the '*Department of Geology Thesis Support Grant Scheme*' in June 2010 for members of academic staff on their PhDs. This was designed as a token incentive for our academic staff who are on training positions to complete their research programme and become prospective postgraduate teachers. Two members of staff benefitted from the maiden award, which carries a monetary value of Fifty Thousand Naira (₦50,000.00) each.
- Three new members of the academic staff were employed. This has brought the total Faculty to 19, currently comprising 5 Professors/Readers, 6 Senior

Lecturers and 8 Lecturer/Assistant Lecturers. A cartographer was also employed, bringing the total non-academic staff (technical and administrative) strength to 10.

The Department secured '*Full Accreditation*' status from the NUC in 2008, with a Programme score of 89% compared with '*Interim Accreditation*' with a Programme Score of 61% in 2005.

### **Honorary Degrees and Fellowships**

On the recommendation of the Senate and the approval of the Council, we awarded honorary degrees and fellowships to a number of respected individuals. This list comprised four iconic and eminent women who are role models. It may be noted that only four women had earlier received honorary degrees of the University of Ibadan from 1963 till 2017, namely Mrs Funmilayo Ransome-Kuti (LLD, 1968), Professor Phyllis Jean Kanki (D,Sc, 2008), Chief Folake Solanke, SAN (D.Lit., 2011) and Professor Adetowun Omolara Ogunshye (D.Lit., 2012).

The Council/Senate Joint Committee on Honorary Degrees and Fellowships at its meeting of Friday 30 October 2020 approved a scoring template which will be useful in assessing nominated candidates for honours and awards, henceforth.

In all, 22 honorary degrees and fellowships were made during the five years tenure. About one-half went to eminent scholars and academics, including three former Vice- Chancellors of the University of Ibadan while the other half were made to outstanding entrepreneurs and friends of the university.

## Categories of Awards

24. **Life Time Awards:** Alumni/alumnae given this category of Award were selected based on their achievements. Most of those who got this category of Award might have reached the peak of their career but not necessarily retired.
25. **Worthy Ambassadors Award:** They are also achievers but still have age on their side, i.e., they still have the prospect of attaining greater heights.
26. **Honorary Ambassadors:** These are friends of the University who have great affinity to the University but are not graduates of the University. Not less than 80 of the Awardees turned up for the Nights of Honour and the number of well-wishers and families that came with them was indicative of how much the Awardees cherished the recognition.

This was a conscious decision taken in order to immortalize these legends who have contributed in no small measures to the current standing of the institution while at the same time inspire the current and future generation of staff and students to give of their best to the University of Ibadan.

1. The Central Administration Building was named after our highly revered **Professor Emeritus Tekena N. Tamuno**, (Alumnus 1953), the first Ibadan Alumnus to be the Vice-Chancellor of the institution (VC from 1975-1979).

2. The Arts Theatre was named after our 1986 **Nobel Laureate in Literature, Professor Emeritus Wole Soyinka** (Alumnus 1953).
3. Naming of a Practical Theatre in the Department of Theatre Arts named after **Geoffrey Axworthy**. (pioneer Lecturer of Theatre arts at the University of Ibadan)
4. The Vice-Chancellor's Official Residence was re-christened as **AYO BANJO MANOR** after the longest serving Vice-Chancellor, Professor Emeritus Ayo Banjo, who served in that capacity from 1983-1991
5. The Conference Centre was named after the Pioneer Chairman of the University of Ibadan Ventures Ltd, a notable Philanthropist and business tycoon, **Otunba Subomi Balogun**.
6. The Headquarters of UI Research Foundation was named after **Rt Hon Dr Imo Justus Itsueli**, Alumnus 1966, and Pioneer Chairman University of Ibadan Research Foundation.
7. A new female Postgraduate Hall of Residence, behind Queen Idia Hall, was named after a foundation student **Felicia Adetowun Omolara Ogunsheye** (Alumnus 1948), the first female professor in Nigeria, and former Dean of Education.
8. The Third Floor Extension of Physiology and Pharmacology Building as well as the Central Animal House named after **Chief Nathaniel Olaniyi Idowu**.
9. The Ajibode Extension was named after one of the former Vice Chancellor, **Professor Samuel Olajuwon Olayide** during whose tenure the Ajibode Extension was acquired as 'Olajuwon Olayide Extension'.
10. The New Admissions Office (Undergraduate) Building was named after the first Indigeneous Registrar, later Vice-Chancellor, University of Lagos and Director, Institute of African Studies, University of Ibadan, **Professor Saburi Oladeni Biobaku** as 'Saburi Biobaku Building'.
11. The Senate Chamber was named after a former Vice Chancellor and the first Nigerian Professor of Psychiatry, and former Deputy General Secretary, World Health Organisation, Professor Thomas Adeoye Lambo as '**Adeoye Lambo Senate Chamber**'. (The initiative for this was first mooted by the late Emeritus Professor Oladipo Olujimi Akinkugbe and strongly supported by the Department of Psychiatry).
12. The new Postgraduate Hall, at the College of Medicine was named after **Emeritus Professor Ayodele Olajide Falase**, Former Dean, Faculty of Clinical Sciences and Dentistry, Former Provost, College of Medicine and the 9<sup>th</sup> Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ibadan, as Ayodele Falase Postgraduate Hall.
13. The Museum of the Institute of African Studies named after the late **Professor Cornelius Adepegba**. (Foremost Art Historian).
14. The road leading to the University of Ibadan Alumni Association (UIAA) Worldwide complex named as Michael Omolayole Close, named after **Dr Michael Olawole Omolayole**, Alumnus 1948, the First National President of UIAA; outstanding industrial executive widely respected as an astute negotiator in industry and labour relations.
15. The Board Room of the Oluwole Akande Building in the College of Medicine after the second Provost of the College, **Professor A.O.K. Johnson** Board Room.
16. The Administrative Building of the Postgraduate College after **Professor Sanya Dojo Onabamiro**, who in 1951 was the first person ever to earn a Ph.D degree in the British Colonial University.
17. Naming of the Anatomy Lecture Theatre in the Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences after **Professor A.B.O. Desalu** who was the Dean of that Faculty from 1984-1986.

18. Naming of the Street leading to the Alumni Building Complex after Dr Michael Omolayole (Alumnus 1948) as **Michael Oluwole Omolayole Close**.
19. Naming of the new Administrative Building of the Distance Learning Centre after **Nde Joshua Mutka WAKLEK**, mni, Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of Council. (The Director of the Distance Learning Centre Professor Babatunde Omobowale had approached me in 2020 that the new building be named after me. I declined because I thought it was unethical for a Committee that I Chaired as the Vice-Chancellor to name a building after myself. I then proposed that in my stead the building should be named after the Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of Council).
20. Department of Geology New Extension
  - **Mosobalaje Oyawoye Building** (the entire complex).
  - **AIUG PENTHOUSE** (The Penthouse and Foyer at topmost floor)
  - **Layi Fatona Lecture Theatre** (on the ground floor)
  - Insignia of ND Western (at the elevator points) as (major) donors of the building.
  - There will be a plaque to indicate the major donors (this would be categorized as Platinum, Gold, Silver, Bronze).
21. Naming of the (old) Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) Lecture Theatre in the Faculty of Science after **Mr Joseph Oladele SANUSI**, former Governor of the CBN, under whose tenure the CBN Lecture Theatre was donated to the University of Ibadan in year 2003. This will avoid confusion in nomenclature with the new CBN Complex for the Department of Economics/Faculty of Economics and Management Sciences

### **Dean, Postgraduate School 2002 to 2006**

- I was elected the 9<sup>th</sup> **Dean of the Postgraduate School** and I had the singular honour and privilege of being the first person to be elected unopposed into that position in the University of Ibadan. I served to the best of my ability from 1 August 2002 till 31 July, 2006. Many colleagues throughout the College of Medicine, all the Faculties, Institutes and Departments, staff of the Postgraduate School and our postgraduate students cooperated towards the smooth running and operations of the School, as the flagship of postgraduate education, training and research in Nigeria and Sub-Saharan Africa.
- On completion of my tenure, I received letters of commendation from the respective Vice-Chancellors under whom I served (Prof A. O. Falase, FAS, NNOM and Prof O. A. Bamiro, FNSE, FAS), the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) (Prof Abiola I. Odejide, FNAL), the Bursar, (Alhaji J. A. Bankole, FCA), the Director of Audit (Mr O. Akinremi, FCA) and numerous colleagues from within and outside the University of Ibadan, for what was considered by them to be an outstanding performance in office.
- There was a 253% *increase in the total revenue generated by the School* from ₦97.6 million in 2001/02 session, to **₦344.5 million** during the 2004/05 session. Academic units benefitted immensely from this improved revenue profile from which they were able to upgrade their teaching and research facilities.
- We introduced payment of *bench fees* for science-based disciplines. This fee was remitted 100% to the students' academic departments to

complement other sources of funds to support laboratory and ICT equipment.

- We established “*The University of Ibadan Postgraduate School Endowment Fund*”.
- A principal sum of **₦25 Million** was invested in shares/stocks of ‘blue-chip’ companies quoted on the Nigerian Stock Exchange. The stocks were worth about **₦62.7 Million** as at the time I completed my tenure as Dean. The dividends are appropriated for research capacity building of postgraduate students and staff.
- To encourage outstanding research students and as a capacity building initiative:
  - We created “*The UI Postgraduate School Scholarship Scheme*” in 2002/03.
  - “*The UI Postgraduate School Teaching and Research Assistantship Scheme*” was set up in 2003/04.A total of 57 PhD students benefited from 2004 to 2006; many of these emerging scholars and early career researchers have already joined the University of Ibadan as Lecturers, thus partly solving our problem of ageing staff. Moreover, many of them are now on the academic staff of sister institutions, thus enhancing the leadership position of the University of Ibadan for advanced training.
- We facilitated a Workshop on *Globalisation of Scholarly Journals*;
- We provided *Funding Support for Publication of Learned Journals* in the College of Medicine, and all the Faculties and Institutes;
- We established the *University of Ibadan Scholarly Publication Global Access (UISPGA)* Committee to facilitate the local indexing of academic titles published in the University
- We encouraged inter- and trans-disciplinary research and maintained an active academic environment in the University and brought the town and gown closer through our *Interdisciplinary Research Discourse Series*. Twenty-two such lectures were held;
- We *published about 36 scholarly titles* some of which are still distributed to new postgraduate students in the University; they are also available on sale at the University Bookshops.
- We produced a *Code of Practice and Ethics for Research Degree Programmes* in the University of Ibadan. UI was arguably the first university in Nigeria to have this home-grown document.
- We designed and published the *University of Ibadan Manual of Style (UIMS)*. This is a uniquely UI referencing style.
- We facilitated the establishment of *new postgraduate courses* in 22 Departments.
- A *review of the Regulations Governing Higher Degrees* was undertaken, 2002 – 2004.
- A comprehensive *Curriculum Review of all Postgraduate Programmes in the University* was embarked upon and was about 80% completed as at 31 July 2006;
- We put in place *quality assurance measures* in our *Postgraduate training and research*;
- We strengthened the *Local Conference Awards for Postgraduate Teachers*. A total of 336 awards were made during my tenure.

- We established *the Overseas Conference Grants for Postgraduate Teachers*. Seventy eight academics received the awards from 2005 to 2006. This initiative was subsequently taken over by the central University Administration, with equity contribution from the Postgraduate School under my successor as Dean.
- *We cleared a 5-year backlog of Degree Certificates* and by 2005 our postgraduate students were able to collect their degree certificates during the convocation or soon after. The School is now up-to-date.
- We generated some *37,400 Transcripts for all higher degrees and postgraduate diplomas from 1975/76 till 2006*.
- We ensured provision of *ICT Infrastructural Support* to the Faculties which did not benefit from the 1<sup>st</sup> Phase. (Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences; Faculty of Agriculture and Forestry; Faculty of Science; Faculty of Law).
- To improve ICT competencies of Postgraduate students in the University:
  - We partnered with Departments/Institutes/Centres a *Counterpart Funding Scheme for the Purchase of Computers* for all the academic units.
- With active support of the Bursary and Internal Audit Units of the University, we streamlined the processing of *External Examiners' Honoraria and Transport Claims*, with a much reduced waiting time before the claims were ready.
- The old block housing the Sub-Dean, Records Section, Deputy Registrar/Secretary, and Examinations Office was re-roofed.
- The former 'Computer Room' was modernized, strengthened and re-christened the '*Data Processing Unit*'.
- An Ad-Hoc Committee was established on the need to reposition the Accounts Section, which was much later upgraded into the status of a Finance Office.
- We organised many Workshops, Seminars and Symposia on aspects of research methodology and research management to which postgraduate students, academic staff from all the departments/centres/institutes were invited as participants. These included the following:
  - Re-engineering and Repositioning the Postgraduate School (October 2 and 3, 2002)
  - Workshop on Writing Grant Proposals for Academic Staff (July 17 and 18, 2003).
  - Workshop on Writing PhD Thesis for Research Students (February 23 and 24, 2004).
  - The First Workshop on Methodology of Basic and Applied Research for Academic Staff and Research Students (November 1 to 5, 2004).
  - Workshop on Contemporary Issues in Research Supervision (March 15 and 16 2005).
  - Workshop on Globalisation of Scholarly Journals (27 and 28 September 2005).
  - Workshop on Scholarly Writing and Publications (23 and 24 November 2005).
  - Symposium on Tracking the Impact of Research: How and Why? (13 January 2006).
  - The Second Workshop on Methodology of Basic and Applied Research for Academic Staff and Research Students (May 1 to 5, 2006).

### **Sub-Dean, Postgraduate School, 1999-2001**

I was elected as the Sub-Dean (Postgraduate School), for the period 1999-2001. In keeping with one of the major duties of the Sub-Dean i.e. "He shall assist the Dean in the day-to-day running of the School", the Dean (Prof B. O. Fagbemi)

and my humble self have worked as a team throughout my tenure. In these pursuits, we have tried to be innovative and creative.

We established the Postgraduate School Conference Grants for Postgraduate Teachers during my first year in office as Sub-Dean. The primary aim of this scheme was to provide some subsidy to enable Postgraduate Teachers attend and present their research findings at learned scientific conferences within Nigeria. We also ensured that awardees received their monies promptly. These awards have continued to be made and the monetary value was reviewed upwards during the 2000/2001 Session.

We observed that, hitherto, there were always delays in the processing of claims in respect of Postgraduate Supervision Allowance in the Postgraduate School. I was mandated by the Dean (Postgraduate School) to investigate the cause of this seeming bottleneck. I carried out this assignment promptly and my recommendations were accepted and implemented by the Dean. The result was noticeable almost immediately. For example, there were at least 13 batches for the transmission of these claims from the Postgraduate School to the Bursary during the 1997/98 Session. We introduced the new and streamlined procedure mid-way into the 1998/99 Session and we were able to complete all the claims for that session in 5 batches. There was a further improvement on this feat for the 2000/2001 Session.

We were able to enhance the efficiency of the administrative staff involved with the routine work while less complaints were received from our colleagues arising largely from non- under- and piecemeal- payment of their entitlements under the old procedure.

We streamlined the procedure for sale of application forms for admission into the Postgraduate School. This entailed my examining the procedure used previously (by consulting with both the Admissions Officer and the SEO (Accounts), the problems associated with the procedure and the way forward. Recommendations were made to the Dean, Postgraduate School which he graciously accepted. The new procedure thus proposed was put into use for the 2001/2002 admission exercise and the bottlenecks hitherto observed were eliminated. Complaints received from Departments have been reduced considerably.

The new procedure now makes it possible to monitor how many forms had been sold on a daily basis for each programme of study in a given Department/Institute, rather than having to wait till the closing date before obtaining such information.

I served as Member/Secretary, Ad-Hoc Sub-Committee of the Executive Committee of the Postgraduate School to investigate the *'Problem of Lecturers having too many Students to Supervise'*, October to December 1999. This was under the Chairmanship of the Dean of Science, Prof O. Osonubi. We assessed the situation and our recommendations were accepted by the Board of the Postgraduate School. These have been incorporated into the Revised Regulations Governing the Award of Higher Degrees in the University of Ibadan.

We ensured regular announcement of fellowships, scholarships, prizes, sabbatical positions, etc from personal contacts with granting bodies and information obtained on the Internet.

We were pro-active in promptly announcing and processing applications of the Bashorun MKO Abiola Travel and Research Fellowships.

We published Volume 3 (nos 1 and 2) of the Synopses of Abstracts of PhD theses submitted to the Postgraduate School. We have almost completed work on typesetting of Volume 4 (nos 1 and 2) and this includes abstracts of M Phil and MPH dissertations in addition to the PhD theses.

In order to improve efficiency and boost morale, we encouraged training and continuous education for all cadres of the administrative staff of the Postgraduate School. Many of them were trained in the use and management of relevant databases and they benefited considerably from such exposures in Information Communications Technology.

As Chairman of the Curriculum Committee, we considered and approved proposals for the following postgraduate courses:

- LLM and PhD in the Faculty of Law,
- Masters in Humanitarian and Refuge Studies (under the auspices of the Centre for Peace and Conflict Studies and assisted with a take-off grant by The Association of African Universities),
- Masters in Psychology of Law, Criminology, and Security –MPLCS- (Dept. of Psychology),
- Master of Integrated Tropical Farm Management (Dept of Agronomy),
- Masters in Agroforestry (Department of Forest Resources Management),
- Masters in Creativity and Innovation (Department of Guidance and Counselling),
- Masters in Veterinary Pharmacy (Dept of Veterinary Physiology and Pharmacology),
- MSc in Housing (Centre for Urban and Regional Planning, CURP),
- MSc in Urban and Regional Planning – both academic and professional programme - (CURP),
- MPhil and PhD in Urban and Regional Planning (CURP),
- Professional Masters in Information Technology (ARCIS),
- Postgraduate Diploma in Information Science (ARCIS)
- Professional Diploma in Teaching in Higher Education (Dept. of Teacher Education), and
- Professional Postgraduate Diploma in Child Health (Institute of Child Health, College of Medicine),

These programmes are expected to commence after approval by Senate.

Moreover, we undertook a major restructuring of:

- the Industrial and Labour Relations Programme in the Department of Sociology, a major feature of which involved designating the MILR course as both academic and professional, and
- the MEd in Guidance Counselling, for various fields of specialisation, along the modern trends in Counselling Psychology and the nature of the labour market.

### **Information Communications Technology (ICT) Programme**

We produced a Data Manager computer package for the storage and retrieval of student'

records. The software has several search possibilities which make it possible for information on any registered student to be obtained effortlessly. This initiative is being extended to other organs of the School including the Examinations Section, Admissions Section, Accounts Section, and the Audit.

### **Construction of Administrative and Students' Utility Building**

Between February and May 2001, the Postgraduate School undertook the construction of a 1-storey Utility Building speedily, to the admiration of the entire University Community.

In November 1999, we organised the African University Day on the Theme: 'Universities and the Development Process'. Similarly, the 13<sup>th</sup> Postgraduate School Interdisciplinary Discourse was held successfully earlier the same week.

### **Lecturer and Researcher in the Department of Geology**

- I was appointed Lecturer II on 21 April 1988; elevated a *Professor of Geophysics I Oct 1999*;

As at the time of my appointment as a Lecturer Grade II in the Department of Geology in April 1988, there was no lecturer of Applied Geophysics in the Department. The onus was then on me to take up the teaching and research in this area and deepen it to become a viable area of specialization. I started teaching the undergraduate and five postgraduate courses in geophysics immediately. By November 1990 I had successfully completed the supervision of three MSc candidates. Till date, I have supervised about 25 BSc, 60 MSc and 18 PhD candidates in Applied Geophysics, Hydrogeology and Petroleum Geology. The candidates presented their research findings at local and international conferences.

- I served as the Departmental Postgraduate Coordinator, 1989-1997.
- I was Head, Department of Geology; 2001 – 2002; 2006 – 2010.
- Currently, I lead an active *Applied Geophysics Research Group* in the Department. Five of my former students are now Professors while several others are Senior Lecturers. Many occupy management positions in oil exploration and production companies in Nigeria, outside the country, and with the Nigerian Geological Survey Agency. Many of them have won awards in the process. These have contributed in some humble ways to the **branding** of the Department of Geology of the University of Ibadan as a leading Geosciences Department among her peers in the country.

  - ◇ In June 2008, I sent a nine-page memorandum titled '*Arrears of Promotion Cases for Academic Staff: Matters Arising*', to the then Vice-Chancellor, Prof Olufemi A. Bamiro, FNSE, FAS. He forwarded my brief to the University Appointments and Promotions Committee which subsequently approved some of my recommendations. These include:
    - That deserving Senior Lecturers, who are *high fliers*, be encouraged to apply for the full professorship after a minimum of five years on the Senior Lectureship cadre (as against six years hitherto)<sup>1</sup>, and
    - Payment of honorarium to Internal Assessors (this later formed part of the 2009 Federal Government-ASUU Agreement).

The University was also responsible for clearing and custom duties, transportation from Lagos to the University of Ibadan and part of the installation cost to the tune of Five Million and Four Hundred Thousand Naira. The equipment donation was facilitated by Professor Olayinka Oridupa, then a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Veterinary Pharmacology and Toxicology, Faculty of Veterinary Medicine.

Grateful acknowledgment is extended to Seeding Labs, Boston, USA, for the donation. The University of Ibadan is putting the equipment into good use to aid research by the postgraduate students and Faculty.

### **Fund Raising Activities as Head, Department of Geology (2001/2002; 2016-2010)**

- The *Association of Ibadan University Geologists* provided a state-of-the-art Petrological Microscope Laboratory in the Department in March 2007. The endowment, comprised two trinocular research microscopes and 21 binocular microscopes, with camera attachments, was valued at Ten Million, Five Hundred Thousand Naira (N10,500,000:00) only. As of the time, the Petrological Microscope laboratory of the Department of Geology at the University of Ibadan was easily the best equipped among all the Universities offering Geosciences.
- We improved the teaching, learning and research environment. The entire departmental complex was re-painted and refurbished in March 2008 at a cost of Two Million, One Hundred Thousand naira (N2,100,000.00) which was raised from donations.
- We attracted the Esso Exploration and Production Nigeria Ltd to fund a Field Mapping Project, in conjunction with the Nigerian Geological Survey Agency (NGSA). Through this initiative,
  - a brand-new 18-seater Toyota Hiace Field Vehicle, valued at Four Million Five Hundred Thousand naira (N4,500,000.00) was donated to the Department in February 2008. This vehicle is still being used by the Department till date (August 2023).
  - our Senior Technologist was sponsored by Esso to undertake a week training course in Scotland in June 2008.


